

Before using the remote control


Loading batteries in the remote control

The remote control uses two type AAA batteries.

 Open the battery compartment cover, and load two AAA batteries, taking care to match the battery polarity with the illustration inside the battery compartment.



Insert the minus (-) pole of the battery first.



2 Replace the battery compartment cover.



∕!\ Warning

- Do not use or store batteries in direct sunlight or other excessively hot place, such as inside a car or near a heater. This can cause batteries to leak, overheat, explode or catch fire. It can also reduce the life or performance of batteries.
- Store small parts out of the reach of children and infants.
 If accidentally swallowed, contact a doctor immediately.

Caution

- Be careful when loading batteries, being sure to match the battery polarity (+, -) with the markings inside the battery compartment.
- When inserting the batteries, make sure not to damage the springs on the battery's (—) terminals. This can cause batteries to leak or overheat.
- . Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Different brands of battery may produce different woltages even when of the same nominal type. As a result, batteries of different brands should not be used together.
- When not using the remote control for extended periods (a month or more), the batteries should be removed to prevent damage from potential leakage of battery fluid. If battery leakage does occur while the battery is loaded in the remote control, wipe the fluid away carefully with a cloth, then install new batteries.
- Do not attempt to disassemble batteries, expose them to excessive heat or dispose of in fire or water.
- When disposing of used batteries, please comply with governmental regulations or environmental public institution's rules that apply in your country/area.
- The batteries supplied with this unit are for testing purposes and may exhibit short lifetimes.

Using the remote control

When using the remote control to operate this unit, the remote control should be pointed at the unit's remote control sensor within the conditions noted below.

- The remote control may not operate correctly if any obstacle is present between the remote control and the unit's remote control sensor, or if the remote control is pointed at the sensor outside the anole noted.
- The remote control may not operate properly if the sensor is exposed to direct sunlight or strong fluorescent light. In such cases, change the installation location or remove the source of fluorescent light.
- Malfunctions may result if the remote control is operated near another device that also emits infrared radiation, or if another remote control using infrared radiation is operated near this unit. Alternately, if this unit's remote control is used near another component also controlled by an infrared remote control, that component may be caused to malfunction.
- If the effective range of remote control operation becomes noticeably shortened, the batteries have reached their lifetime and should be replaced.




Installation


Install the unit on a surface that is level and secure.

- · Do not install the unit in the following kinds of location:
 - On top of a television set (the television images may be distorted).
 - On top of a cassette deck or other device emitting magnetism (audio quality may be adversely affected).
 - In locations exposed to direct sunlight.
 - In locations exposed by high humidity.
 - In locations exposed to direct contact with water.
 - In locations exposed to very high or very low temperatures.
 - In locations exposed to vibration.
 - In locations exposed to much dust or cigarette smoke.
- In kitchens or other locations exposed to oil or smoke.
- If the unit is installed on a sofa or other sound-absorbing surface, it may fail to produce correct sound quality.



Use to alternate power status between ON and STANDBY modes.

2 MUTE button

During playback, press to temporarily mute the sound.

■ VOL +/- buttons

Press these buttons to raise/lower the sound volume.

Direct input selector buttons

Press one of the USB/COAX/OPT/AES EBU buttons to select the desired source.

LOCK RANGE button

Press to adjust the DAC locking range.

6 DIRECT button

Press this button to output the input signal as is, without passing through the DSP.

Hi-Bit 32 button

Press to change the Hi-Bit 32 setting.

8 DIMMER button

Press to adjust the display's brightness.

9 FINE +/- buttons

Use to finely adjust the headphone volume (this adjustment affects only the headphone output).


DIGI FILTER button

Press to change the type of digital filter used.

Display window

8 Remote control sensor

VOLUME knob

In order to control the sound volume of a component connected to the unit's analog output connector,

Selector switch 1 (on unit's rear panel) must be set to VARIABLE.

PHONES GAIN knob

Use to adjust the headphones gain.

OUTPUT knob

Use to select the type of output, including LINE, and PHONES 1 to PHONES 3.

Headphones connectors (PHONES 1, 2, 3)

Use to connect headphones.

FINE ADJUST knob

Use to finely adjust the headphone volume (this adjustment affects only the headphone output).

Operation

Basic operation

1 Turn power ON.

Press the front-panel **6/I STANDBY/ON** button.

The power indicator in the center of the button will light.

2 Select the desired output connector.

Rotate the front-panel **OUTPUT** knob.

Set to LINE to select the analog output connector.

3 Select the desired input source.

Rotate the front-panel **INPUT** knob, or press the corresponding **direct input selector** button on the remote control.

- . The selected input will appear in the display window.
- DSD data can be played only when using the USB connection.

4 Operate the playback device.

For details, consult the operating instructions for your playback device.

5 Adjust the sound volume.

Rotate the unit's front-panel **VOLUME** knob, or use the **VOL +/-** buttons on the remote control.

Using headphones

1 Connect your headphones.

Connect your headphones to the appropriate frontpanel connectors (PHONES 1 to 3).

2 Select the headphones output.

Use the front-panel **OUTPUT** knob to select the connector to which you have attached the headphones.


3 Adjust the headphone gain.

The front-panel **PHONES GAIN** knob can be used select **LOW** or **HIGH** gain.

Under normal conditions, **HIGH** gain should be selected. If the sound is distorted when the volume is low, however, **LOW** gain can be selected to equalize the acoustic quality.

4 Make fine adjustments to the headphones volume.

Use the front-panel **FINE ADJUST** knob or the remote control's **FINE +/-** buttons to make fine adjustments.



- Adjustments are possible within ±6 steps of the reference value.
- Settings are retained even after using the VOL +/button or VOLUME knob.

Settings

Direct setting

Input signals are output directly, without passing through the DSP.

This makes it possible to achieve audio output loyal to the original input signal.

- . Factory default setting: ON
- 1 Change the setting
 - Each time the remote control's **DIRECT** button is pressed, the setting alternates between ON and OFF
 - When the function is set to ON, the front-panel DIRECT indicator lights.




Hi-Bit 32 setting

This setting increases the dynamic range of digital audio signals.

Audio signals between 16 bit and 24 bit are requantized to 32-bit signals, making possible musical expression that is smoother and more finely graded.

This setting is supported when the Direct setting is OFF, and has effect only on linear PCM signals.

- . Factory default setting: ON
- 1 Change the setting.
 - Each time the remote control's Hi-Bit 32 button is pressed, the setting alternates between ON and OFF
 - When the function is set to ON, the front-panel Hi-Bit 32 indicator lights.



Up Sampling setting


This function raises the sampling frequency for playback, making possible clear, highly transparent audio playback.

This setting is supported when the Direct setting is OFF, and has effect only on linear PCM signals.


· Factory default setting: LOW

Change the setting.

 Each time the remote control's Up Sample button is pressed, the function cycles through the following: LOW → HIGH → OFF.



 When set to LOW or HIGH, the unit's front-panel Up Sampling indicator lights.



 At the various settings, playback is performed with sampling frequencies raised as indicated in the accompanying chart.


Changing digital filters

Individual settings can be made for PCM and DSD input signals.

1 Change the setting.

Settings for digital inputs, or settings when playing PCM data from a USB connection.

Each time the remote control's DIGI FILTER button is pressed, the function cycles in the order SHARP -> SLOW → SHORT. Select the value desired.




SHARP: Produces a somewhat hard-edged sound. Produces a softer, gentler sound. SHORT: Produces more aggressive sound with rapid

uptake.

· Factory default setting: SHARP

Settings for DSD data playback from USB input.

Each time the remote control's DIGI FILTER button is pressed, the function cycles in the order MODE 1 → MODE 2 → MODE 3. Select the value desired.



When set to MODE 1 → MODE 2 → MODE 3. produces progressively reduced attenuation of highrange sounds beyond the audible spectrum.

. Factory default setting: MODE 1

Adjust the DAC locking range

This function allows adjustment for those times when the ultimate in high fidelity sound quality is demanded.

Even with the same jitter clock input, by narrowing the locking range, collateral sounds and overtones can be reduced, thus raising the quality of the sound.

However, if the locking range is narrowed excessively, input signals with a high level of jitter may cause the lock to slip, producing interruptions or dropouts in the sound. In such cases, adjust the locking range to a slightly wider value while listening to the sound, until the sound returns to normal.

Signal dropout when the locking range is narrowed (other than at normal times) falls outside warranted operating conditions. In such cases, widen the locking range setting until the dropout stops. This unit records the adjusted locking range set for each independent input source.

Select lock range setting mode.

Press the remote control's LOCK RANGE button and enter the setting mode.





2 Change the setting.

Press the remote control's FINE +/- buttons to change the locking range. Each time one of the buttons is pressed, the set value changes (4 steps), as follows.

FINE (-) button (pressed once): narrows locking range



FINE (+) button (pressed once): widens the locking range

LOCK RANGE

- . If the setting is changed to any value other than the default "normal", the front-panel LOCK RANGE ADJUST indicator will light.
- . If any button on the remote control other than FINE +/- is pressed, the display window will change to show the current input source.

■ For advanced users

If the LOCK RANGE button is held depressed for five seconds or more, the ability to narrow the lock range will be extended by three additional steps. However, as noted in the "Caution" note below, users should be aware that using these extended steps will produce a very delicate mode easily subject to dropouts.



Normal settings



- Even more delicate sound quality adjustments are possible, but the frequency of dropouts greatly increases, with the result that these steps should not be taken except by advanced users. In particular, when two tracks with differing sampling frequencies and bit rates are played consecutively, the playback may demonstrate a high propensity for dropouts.
- . Even if Up Sampling has been set and the sampling frequency raised, sound will still be prone to dropouts.
- . If signal dropout occurs, try readjusting the lock range to a wider value so that the sound appears normal. Narrowing the width of the lock range setting (other than in normal conditions) is considered outside the range of warranted operation as regards signal dropout. In such cases, widen the lock range setting until dropouts do not occur.
- . To return the lock range to the standard 4 steps, return the setting to factory defaults (see page 11: To return settings to factory defaults).

Setting auto power down

This function automatically turns off the power if no input signal (including silence) or other user operation is detected for a period of 15 minutes.

- · Factory default setting: ON
- 1 Set auto power down.

With the power set to OFF, hold the front-panel 6/1 STANDBY/ON button depressed for 5 seconds or more until power turns ON.

Use the same procedure to turn the auto power down setting OFF.



Note

. If even an inaudible level of signal is detected, the unit will consider it a valid signal, thus preventing the auto power down function from operating.

Adjusting the level of illumination (DIMMER) in the display window and indicators

Adjust illumination in the display window. When set to OFF, the display window and indicators are turned off. By disconnecting power to the display window, minute amounts of electronic noise can be reduced.

- · Factory default setting: 4 (brightest)
- 1 Adjust the dimmer.

Repeatedly pressing the remote control's DIMMER button cycles the display illumination through 4 levels and OFF (4 \rightarrow 3 \rightarrow 2 \rightarrow 1 \rightarrow OFF).



Operation

To return settings to factory defaults

Perform this operation to return the unit's settings to factory default values.

 With the unit in STANDBY mode, hold the remote control's Up Sample button depressed and then press the main unit's front-panel O/I STANDBY/ON.



2 Press the remote control's DIRECT button. The display will ask for final confirmation.



3 To confirm the reset operation, press the remote control's DIGI FILTER button. All settings will be returned to their factory default values.



Using the USB DAC function

Install the driver

 Music files located on a computer can be played by this unit through a USB connection between the computer and this unit. In order to play files in this way, however, a special driver may need to be installed on your computer. For more information, please consult the Pioneer website, where you can find instructions regarding driver installation and computer settings.

Playing music files located on a computer

By using a USB cable to connect this unit to your computer, the computer's audio playback software can be used to play the computer's music files through this unit.

Playing music files located on a computer

- Use a USB cable to connect this unit to your computer.
- 2 Turn on power to the computer.
- 3 Turn on power to this unit.
- 4 Select the proper output connector.

 Rotate the front panel OUTPUT knob to select the

When the output is from the analog output connector, select LINE.

- 5 Set the input selector to USB. Rotate the unit's front-panel INPUT knob, or press the remote control's USB button.
- 6 Play the desired music file located on the computer.

Note

- When using a USB connection from a computer to this unit for playing music, the following signal formats can be input to this unit from the computer:
 - Linear PCM
 - Quantization bits: 16 bit, 24 bit, 32 bit
 - Sampling rate: 44.1 kHz, 48 kHz, 88.2 kHz, 96 kHz, 176.4 kHz, 192 kHz, 352.8 kHz, 384 kHz
 - DSD
 - Sampling rate: 2.8 MHz, 5.6 MHz
- Before disconnecting the USB cable, always be sure to stop the computer's playback first.
- If the computer's USB port does not conform to the USB 2.0 HS standard, playing music files may not be possible.
- When using a USB connection as described above, this unit's playback function cannot be used to play music files; playback must be performed with the computer's own playback software.

Additional information

Troubleshooting

If you think something is wrong with the unit, perform the checks listed here. Often, a minor error in operation may be mistaken for a malfunction. In addition, the symptom may have been caused by other nearby devices, so checks should also be made of components being used concurrently. If the following checks do not remedy the problem, consult the store where you purchased the unit, or your nearest Pioneer service station.

· Static electricity and other environmental factors may cause the unit to operate erratically. In such cases, the problem may be rectified by disconnecting the power plug, then plugging it in again. If this does not remedy the problem, consult the store where you purchased the unit, or your nearest Pioneer service station.

Additional information

Precautions

When moving this unit

When moving this unit, be sure to press the O STANDBY/ ON button on either the remote control or the main unit's front panel to turn off the power. After confirming that the front-panel power indicator has gone out, disconnect the power cord.

After disconnecting the power cord, continue by disconnecting all connected components and devices. Attempting to move the unit with cords still attached to the connectors can result in accidental damage.

Installation location

- Choose a stable location close to the other devices that will be used with the unit.
- · Avoid the following kinds of places:
 - Locations exposed to direct sunlight
 - Locations with high humidity or poor ventilation
 - Locations susceptible to direct contact with water
 - Locations exposed to extreme heat or cold
 - Locations exposed to vibration
 - Locations exposed to much dust
 - Locations exposed to oily smoke, steam, or heat (e.g., kitchens)

Do not place other objects on top of the unit. Do not place other objects on top of the unit.

Do not allow heat to collect in the unit

Do not use the unit when placed on a long-pile carpet, bed, or sofa, nor when wrapped in cloths, etc. Such conditions can contribute to the excessive concentration of heat in the unit, leading to malfunctions or damage.

Avoid heat

Do not install this unit on top of an amplifier or other heatemitting device. When installing the unit in a rack, install the unit on a shelf lower than amplifiers, to avoid adverse influences from the amplifier(s) heat.

Regular care and maintenance

- Dust the unit occasionally with a soft dry cloth. If required for severe soiling, soak a cleaning rag in a 1:6 mixture of mild detergent and water, then wring the rag well and wipe the unit clean. Afterwards, be sure to dry any moisture on the unit with a soft, dry cloth.
- Do not use alcohol, thinner, benzene, insecticide or other volatile compounds to clean the unit, since imprinting or coatings may peel from the unit. The cabinet may also be discolored or damaged from long exposure to rubber or vinyl products.
- Before wiping the unit with any chemical-impregnated cleaning cloths, carefully read the cautionary notices accompanying the cloth.
- Always unplug the power cord from its outlet before cleaning the unit.
